Do I need a power adapter in Fiji?

Fiji has Type I power plugs with 240 V AC 50 Hz - see [Fiji travel adapters here](#). If you're coming from New Zealand or Australia (where most visitors to Fiji are from), you will not need a travel adapter. Some off-the-grid resorts may have limited power, so you may not be able to use more powerful appliances like hair dryers.

Do US plugs work in Fiji?

No, US plugs typically don't work in Fiji without an adapter. Fiji uses Type I power outlets, which have three flat pins in a triangular pattern. US plugs (Type A and B) have two or three flat parallel pins. To use your US devices in Fiji, you'll need a power adapter.
