Common examples are refrigerators, air-conditioning units, and pumps. AC output voltage This value indicates to which utility voltages the inverter can connect. For inverters designed for residential use, the output voltage is 120 V or 240 V at 60 Hz for North America. It is 230 V at 50 Hz for many other countries.

How do you classify an inverter based on its power output?

Using the CEC efficiency, the input power to the inverter must be $P_{IN} = P_{OUT} / \text{CEC Efficiency}$. $3,300 \text{ W} / 0.945 = 3,492 \text{ W}$ Inverters can be classed according to their power output.
